Reading/Writing Activities

<p>Play the animal alphabet game. Name a letter and sound and see if your child can think of an animal that begins with it.</p>	<p>Continue to play the animal game. Make an animal sound and see if your child can name the animal and the letter it begins with.</p>	<p>Play a fun letter scavenger hunt game. Tell your child a letter name or sound and have them find something that begins with the letter.</p>
<p>Read a book to your child. Ask them to tell you the people, animals, or objects (characters) in the story and place (setting) the story happens. Have them retell the beginning, middle, and end of the story.</p>	<p>Write your child's name on One piece of paper *One a second piece of paper writes their name AND tears each letter into a piece. *Have your child put the letters in the correct order. *Then, touch and say the name of each letter with your child repeating it.</p> <p>EX: Tom then cut apart T , o , m</p>	<p>Work together and write a list of things. <p>Gummy Bear Dance (Youtube): https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=6Q7-tzCCh3w</p> <p>After watching, act like a bear and walk around the house.</p>	<p>Freeze Dance: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=2UcZWXvgMZE</p> <p>After the video, practice saying “freeze” and freeze while walking, running, and jumping.</p>	<p>We’re Going on a Lion Hunt: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=03i5v1PS7P4</p> <p>After watching, act like a lion and walk around the house.</p>

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Art Activities

Using a fork and some paint, dip the top part of the fork in paint and use it like a stamp, then using your finger and green paint, make a green line off of the fork print and add leaves. Makes a Tulip-like flower picture.

Go outside and find good size rocks, paint the rocks with different designs. You could take a walk and place your painted rocks in different places for others to find.

Using sidewalk chalk, go outside and create a big picture on the sidewalk or driveway

Color a toilet paper roll, cut out an oval for a mouth, draw on 2 eyes and create a TP roll monster.

Paper plate fish

Color a paper plate, on one side cut a large triangle out, glue/tape the small point of the large triangle to the opposite side, add an eye

Take an empty toilet paper roll, on one end, cut stripes all around, flatten the stripes, dip the strips in paint and stamp them onto a paper

Using uncooked noodles (macaroni, spaghetti, etc) glue onto a paper and make a picture. When the glue is dry you can gently color the noodles with markers or paint.

Trace your hand on a paper, Cut it out and make it into something. You can move your fingers around before you trace them to form different animals.

Draw a large oval, decorate it as an easter egg. Cut it out and hang it on your window. Have a parent drive you around town and look for other eggs in the windows.

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Music Activities

Go on a Sound Hunt-Either outside or inside. Walk around and listen closely. Describe what sounds you hear. Have an adult write them down then discuss afterwards and try to make the sound again on your own.

Explore different sounds- Fill glasses with different amounts of water. Lightly tap each to hear the different tones made by each glass. Once you have listened to all of the different tones, see if you can make a song using them.

Color to music- Turn on some music and have your child color or paint to the music. Tell them to listen to the way the music sounds and color along with that. Then change the music to something slower or faster and ask your child to change with the music.

Water Bottle Maracas-Use empty water bottles and any small hard objects(beads, safety pins, buttons, pennies, rocks) Put them inside, secure the lid and shake them up!

Make a Kazoo- You will need an empty toilet paper roll. One rubber band, and a square of wax paper. Have your child decorate the toilet paper roll with crayons, markers or paint. When that is finished, place the square of wax paper on one end of the roll and secure it there with the rubber band. Then your child can sing or talk into it and listen to the vibrating sound.

Move to the Beat with a Sheet- Use a sheet like a big parachute. Stand at opposite ends and hold the sheet tight. Turn on some music and raise, lower and shake the sheet to the music. Add stuffed animals or balls to bounce around on the sheet while you move it!

Rhythm Sticks- While on a walk, find two sticks on the ground. Tap them together to hear the sound they make. Then use them to make a beat. Also, use them as drumsticks! With adult approval, tap the sticks on other items to hear what sounds those items make.

Have a dance party.

Add Karaoke! Use the radio. Use any household item as a “microphone” and sing along with your favorite radio songs!

Musical Letters- Write letters on separate pieces of paper. Can use any letters, but a good place to start would be the letters in your child’s name. Each letter gets its own piece of paper. Place each paper around on the floor, mix up the letters, don’t put them in any kind of order. Next turn on some music and have your child walk or dance around the letters. When the music stops, have your child pick a letter to stand on. Have your child tell you what letter they have chosen. Take that letter out, then start again. Continue until all of the letters have been named!
